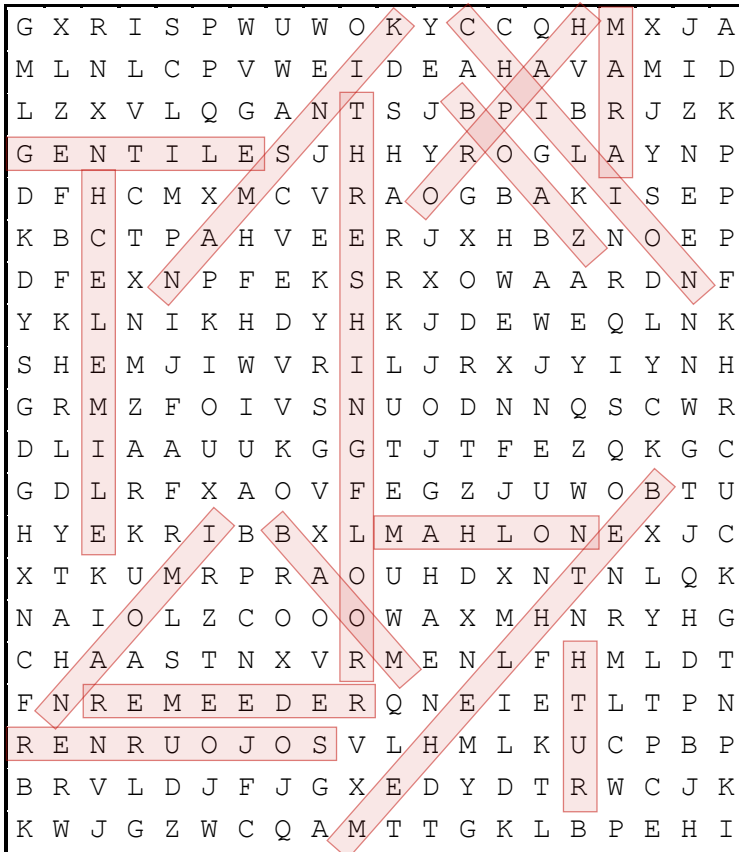


# SEEKING SCRIPTURE
